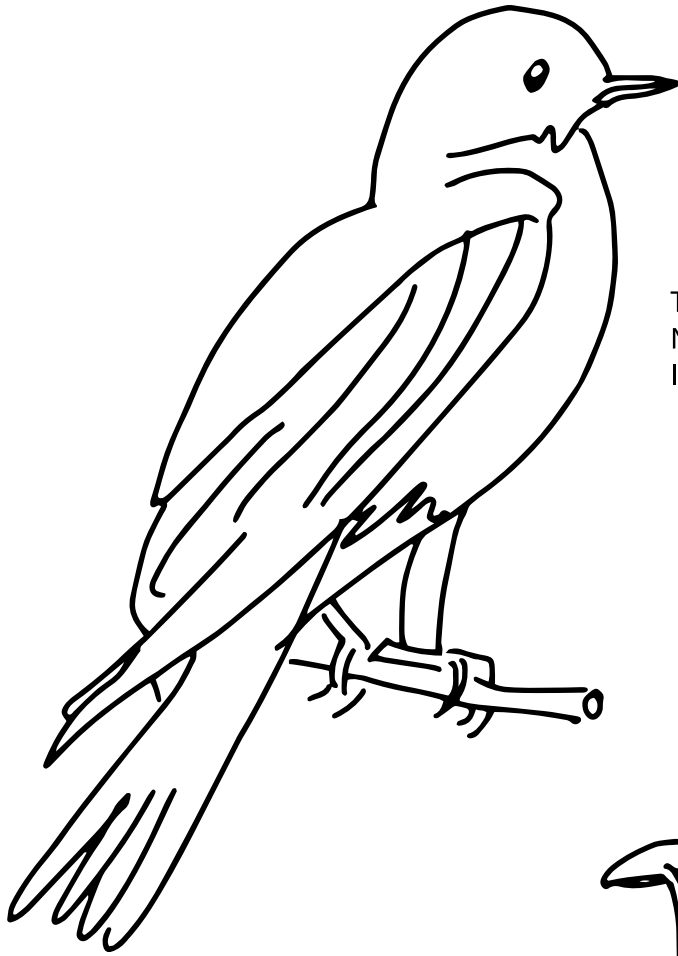


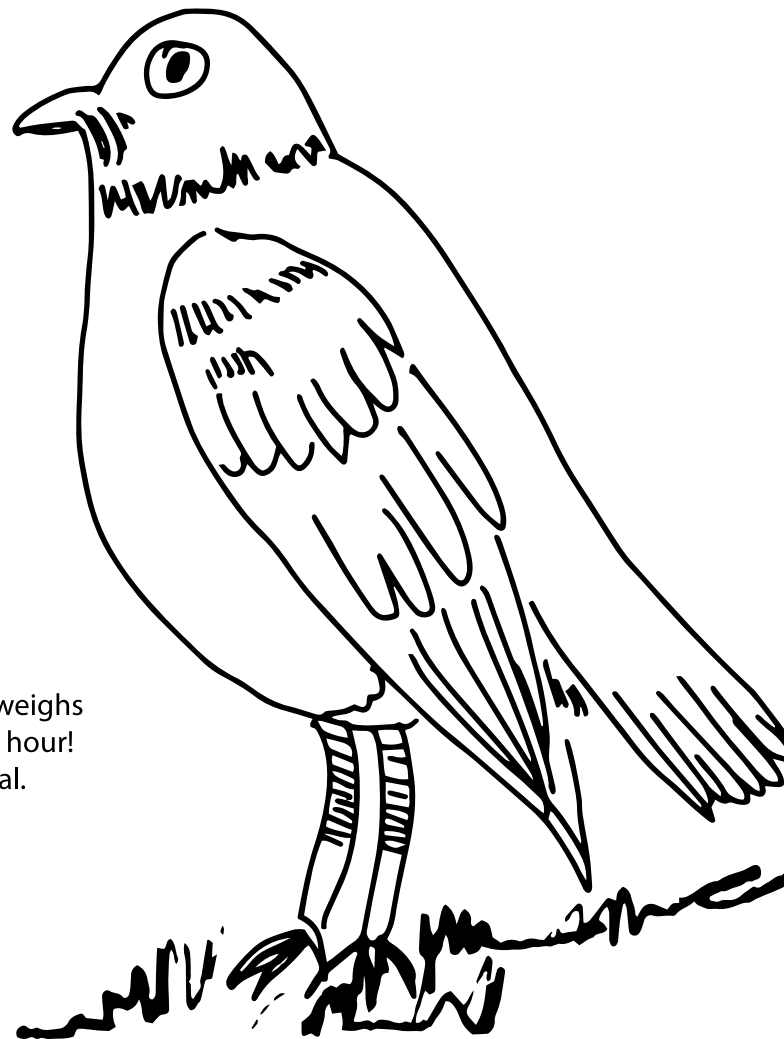

Critter Coloring Book

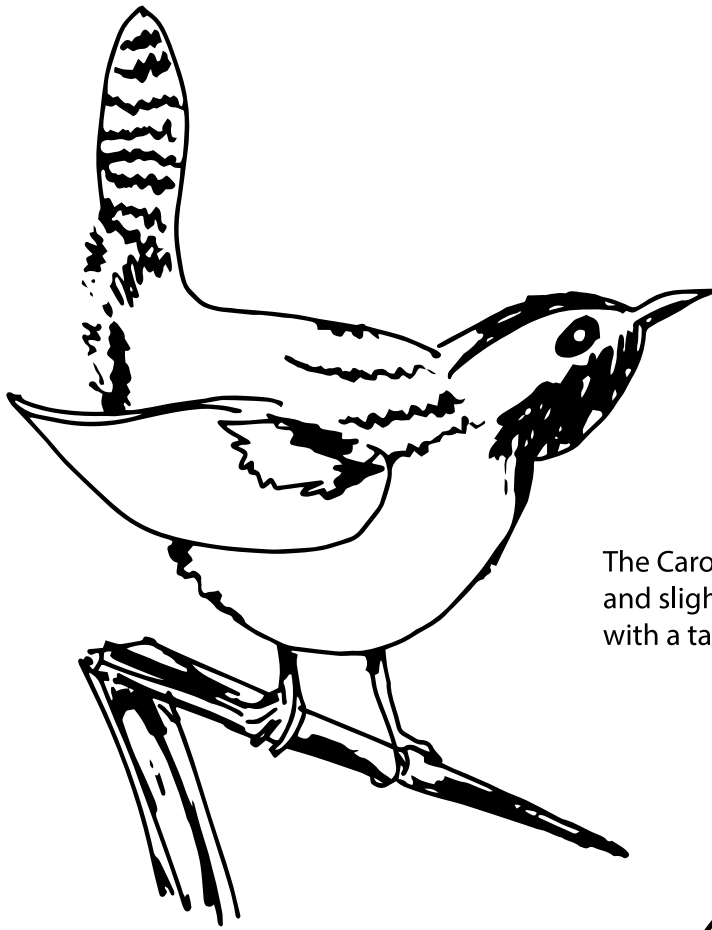
Learn about the animals and birds in

The American Robin is the most abundant bird in North America, living from southern Canada to Mexico. It eats grubs, earthworms, fruits and berries.



The Eastern Bluebird is generally 6-8" long, weighs about 1 ounce and can fly up to 17 miles an hour! They are family oriented birds and very social.

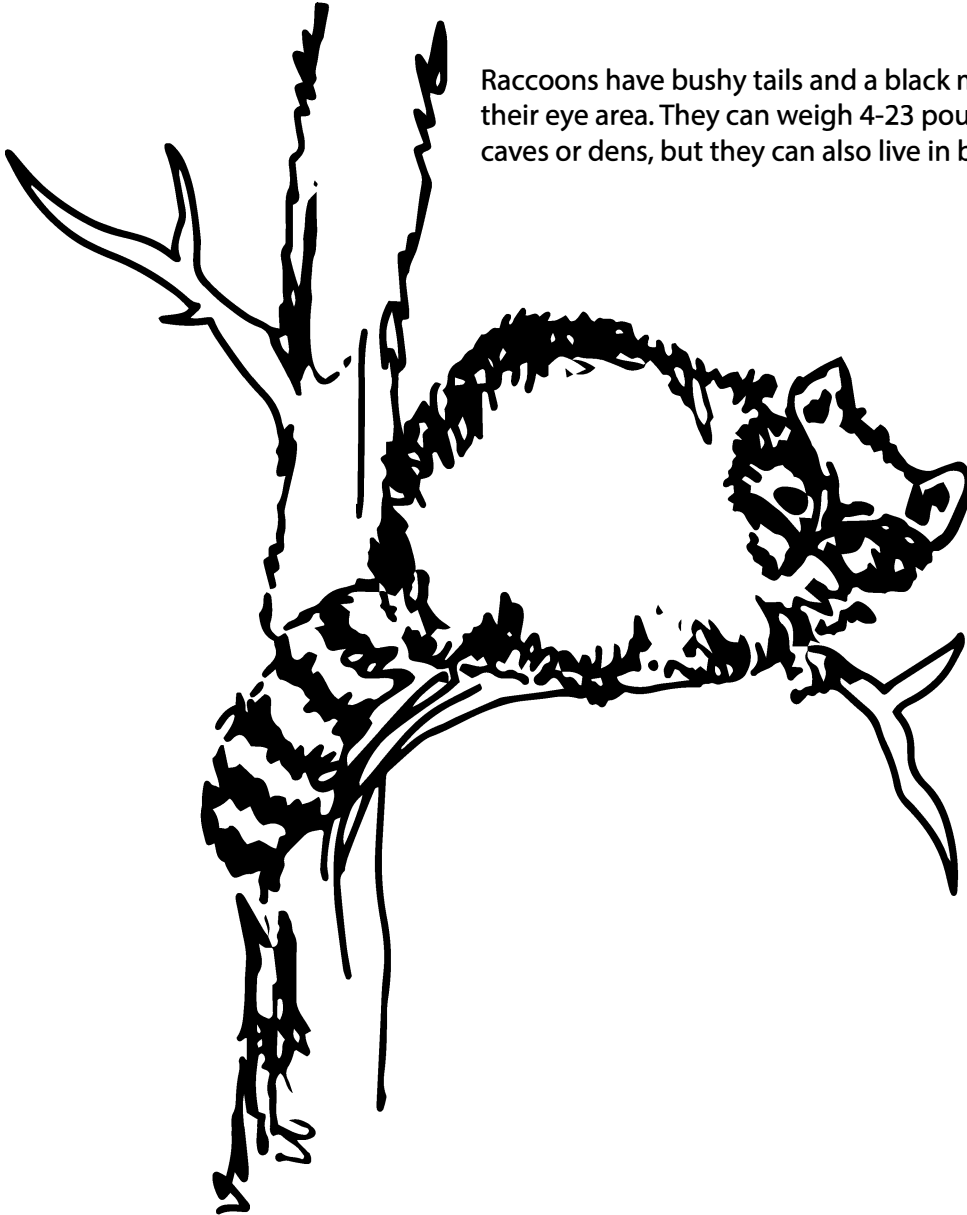


The Carolina Wren has a distinctive bill that is slender and slightly curved downward. These birds are perky with a tail that points up.



The Northern Cardinal has a distinctive crest on its head and the male has a black mask on its face and a gray mask for females.

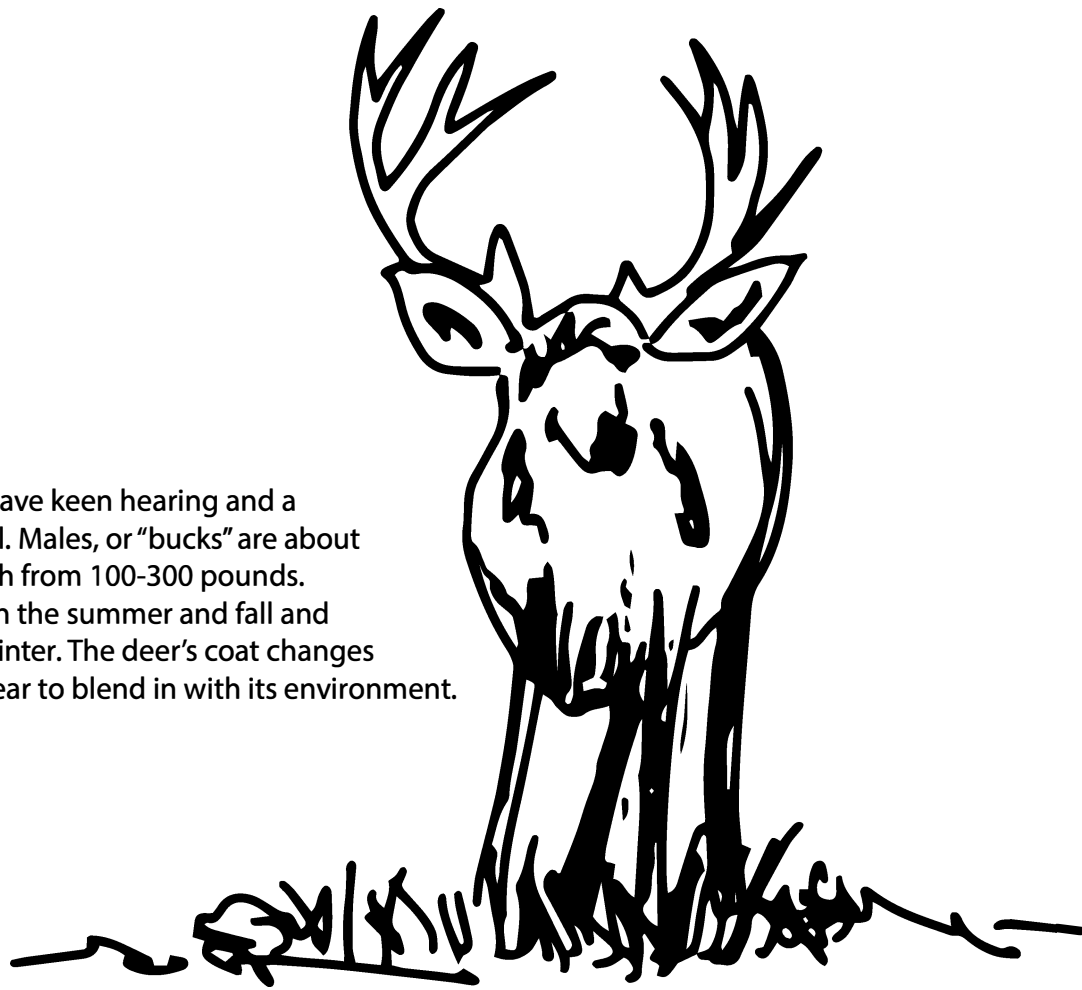
Raccoons have bushy tails and a black mask of fur that covers their eye area. They can weigh 4-23 pounds and live in trees, caves or dens, but they can also live in barns or abandoned vehicles.



The Eastern Gray Squirrel lives in a group called a "scurry." They are important in the forest because they bury their nuts and seeds to eat later and if they don't eat them the buried food sprouts and grows new plants in different places.



White Tailed Deer have keen hearing and a good sense of smell. Males, or "bucks" are about 6 or 7' tall and weigh from 100-300 pounds. They grow antlers in the summer and fall and shed them in the winter. The deer's coat changes colors during the year to blend in with its environment.



Black bears usually hibernate in the winter and come out very hungry in the spring, especially if a female has cubs to feed. They eat just about anything they can find.
